Attention Parents and Students: In order to receive your prom tickets this year, **this contract must be signed by both the student and the parent(s)**. The contract must then be turned in to the faculty member selling tickets.

No tickets will be sold without the signed contract.

Dress Code Guidelines (Females):

- Necklines should have suitable coverage. Low-cut or plunging necklines are unacceptable.
- The back of the dress should fall above the natural hipline, with sufficient coverage.
- Cut-outs should be of a modest design.
- Dress length or slits should not reveal the leg more than 4 inches above the knee.
- **Sheer or nude fabric is not acceptable.**

Dress Code Guidelines (Males):

- Tuxedos or suits are required.
- Dress pants are required.
- No hats may be worn inside the building, unless appropriate to the attire.
- Dress shirts must be worn at all times and may not be removed.
- If your shirt is semi-transparent (ex: white dress shirts), an undershirt must be worn.
- Dress pants must be pulled up and secure around your waist at all times.
- **Jeans (denim or colored) are not permitted.**

Behavior and Dance Code Policy:

- **Party buses are NOT permitted.** Limousines, and personal vehicles **may be subjected to searches without cause.**
- The SLHS prom is a Pasco County sanctioned event; therefore, all rules, policies, and procedures outlined in the SLHS student handbook (which can be found online via the Handbook Canvas Site) will be strictly enforced.
- Dancing that is deemed sexually lewd, promiscuous, or suggestive in any form or any behavior deemed to break the Pasco County and/or SLHS rules will not be tolerated and **will result in immediate removal** from the dance.
- Any student under the influence or in possession of any illegal substance, including, but not limited to alcohol, illegal drugs, or tobacco will be referred to local law enforcement and can receive up to 10 days suspension, which may result in the student **not being permitted to participate in any graduation activities.**
- All attendees must abide by the rules in a respectable manner both on and off the dance floor.
- If any student is in violation of any of the above-mentioned infractions, the parent(s) **must pick up the student immediately from the dance.**

Criteria to Attend Prom:

- Attendance: No more than 10 unexcused absences (or more than 50% of the student's school day) in the semester
 - Excuse notes are due within 3 days of the absence
- Referrals: No students with level 3 referrals will be allowed to attend prom
 - Students with level 2 referrals must go through an appeal process
 - Please see Mrs. Latimore (4-167) for this information
- All students must still meet attendance and behavior criteria after the purchase of their tickets up until the date of prom

Pasco County's Social Host Law

Statute 856.015

What is the Social Host Law?

- The primary purpose of the Social Host Law is to deter underage drinking: parties or gatherings, where adults knowingly allow minors to drink alcohol or alcoholic beverages. The law applies to any adult (including parents) who are over the age of 18 and knowingly allow consumption of alcohol by minors (any person under the age of 21).

Why is the Law Needed?

- The law provides a basic legal basis for holding adults responsible for knowingly allowing parties for individuals under the age of 21 to occur at a place under their control, whether or not they provide the alcohol.

What Does the Law State?

- If the social host knows that an underage individual is in the possession of an alcoholic beverage or drug, and the host does not take reasonable action to prevent the possession or consumption of the alcoholic beverage or drug then the host will be charged with a violation and face a maximum fine of \$500 and/or a maximum sentence of 60 days imprisonment. This is a misdemeanor of the 2nd Degree.

What is "Reasonable Corrective Action"?

- Reasonable corrective action shall include, but are not limited to:
 - Making a prompt demand that the minor(s) stop drinking the alcoholic beverage or leave the premises; and
 - If the minor refuses to comply with the request, the adult must promptly report the underage drinking to:
 - Local law enforcement
 - Any other person with greater degree of authority over the minor (e.g. the minor(s) parent(s) or guardian(s))

Liability Prevention Tips for Hosts:

- Never serve or allow alcohol to be served to minors in your home or on your property.
- Prevent alcohol from being served to or by minors when you are not home.
- Never purchase alcohol for minors.
- Always serve food at a party and provide plenty of non-alcoholic beverages.
- Limit your own drinking in order to look after your guests.
