ACT, SAT & the CLT: How Do I Register?

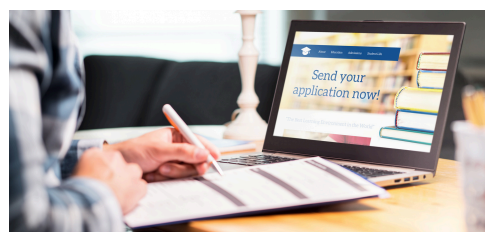
The SAT, ACT and the CLT are all digital assessments which are designed to measure high school students readiness for college. Comparison charts and articles can be found online.

Navigating College Applications

Applying for college can be an overwhelming process. Break down the process into small short-term goals. Before you know it, you will be waiting on your acceptance emails!

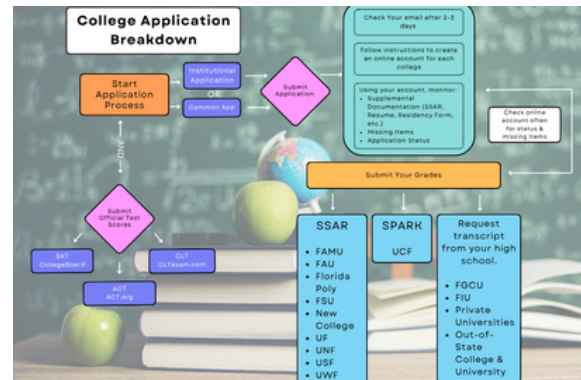
- Complete an online application through the college's website or the [Common Application](#) website. ([Check out Common App Resources.](#))
- Send your SAT and/or ACT and/or CLT scores to the colleges you are interested in applying. You will do this by logging into your SAT, ACT or CLT account.
- Report your grades completing the [Self-Student Academic Report \(SSAR\).](#)

Community Service and Work Hours-How to Submit

We're Going Paperless!

Students can now submit their community service and/or work hours through a [link](#) available on the school's website. Whenever possible, aim to submit your hours each quarter. These logged hours are important for Bright Futures scholarship evaluations during senior year. For detailed requirements, see page 4 of this document.

Pro Tip: Community service hours are not required for high school graduation, but they are strongly recommended for scholarships.



Requesting Transcripts or Self-Reporting- Which is best?

Submitting Your Grades to Colleges

Reporting your grades is a required part of the college application process. Over time, colleges and universities have updated their policies on how they receive this information. Many now ask students to self-report their grades using platforms like the SSAR (Self-Reported Student Academic Record) or SPARK form. You can find your unofficial transcript on My Student under the Reports tab.

Wondering where to submit this information? Once you've applied, instructions will appear in your student application portal. Keep in mind that some schools—especially private colleges—may require your high school to submit transcripts directly. To request this, simply use the online link provided on the school's website.

All college bound students and their parents (who are referred to as “contributors”) should fill out the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA).


The FAFSA is available October 1. Apply early for the best chance of receiving the aid you need!






You can fill out the FAFSA on a computer or mobile device.

Filling out the FAFSA is free. Never pay a company or service to process your FAFSA.

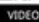


\$ By completing the FAFSA, you automatically apply for a Pell Grant (free money).

Don't let the FAFSA intimidate you, and don't assume that you won't be eligible for any aid.
